## About the Organization:

The Mennonite New Life Centre (MNLCT) is a vibrant, multi-cultural settlement agency for newcomers to Canada. The Centre provides a variety of settlement services, including language instruction, mental health supports and capacity building workshops, public education and bridging to employment. The Centre is a tech-forward charity that utilizes technology solutions to meet the needs of its stakeholders. As a result, several of our services and programs are delivered in a hybrid format, offering clients and participants to conference-in and to use a variety of online tools.

## About the position:

The CNC Lead (Childminding Supervisor) is responsible for the design and implementation of safe, creative, engaging, supportive and stimulating curriculum for children, ages 6 months to 5 years, registered in the LINC/ Care for Newcomer Children Program. Weekly routine includes play time, physical activity, arts, music, snacks as well as rest time and online environment.

# **Responsibilities (CNC Online format):**

- Responsible for all aspects of CNC Online, including curriculum, research, and selection of content
- Conduct research on specific topics and select content
- Design and implement curriculum
- Hosting or co-hosting Zoom connections
- Welcome, facilitate, help and problem solve to newcomer parents when joining CNC Online meetings
- Enroll parents and children who wish to participate in CNC online
- Keep attendance records to CNC Online meetings
- Under the Modified Service Delivery Plan the CNC Lead (Childminding Supervisor) position will provide Online services focusing on:
  - Supporting newcomer parents and children during the pandemic. (The MNLCT is not currently offering in-person services until further notice)
  - Delivering a series of regular live video communications to support newcomer families through lockdown and isolation
  - o Offering creative entertaining, and enriching content for children and parents
  - Delivering 6 online presentations per week (Two 30-min connections each day on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays).

# **Responsibilities (CNC in-person format):**

• In-person care will be re-established in the future, as soon as provincial, local health authorities and funders allow the Centre to resume services



- Design a safe, creative, engaging, supportive, culturally sensitive and stimulating daily routine for children registered in the program, including play time, physical activity, arts, crafts, music, as well as rest time and weekly snack menu
- Make sure the CNC Program is delivered in full compliance with "LINC Care for Newcomer Children Requirements", behavior management policies, suspected sexual/physical abuse reporting policies, fire safety/emergency guidelines incident/ accident reporting and any other relevant policies and procedures
- Complete registration/ intake process by opening a file for each child enrolled
- Keep attendance records
- Ensure that children are always supervised and safe
- Supervise all Assistant Childminders. Always meet staff/ child ratios
- Ensure that new, supply staff and volunteers receive the required documentation, orientation, and training, prior to the commencement of their work
- Keep an up-to date list for supply CNC staff and up-to-date files for both supply and permanent staff
- Communicate with parents
- Purchase snacks, supplies and teaching materials
- Oversee the daily routine of the CNC program
- Respond sensitively to the cultural heritage and individual experience of each child
- Work with parents, applying a culturally sensitive approach, to identify the individual child's personality and adjustment needs
- Receive training, learn, understand, and apply all MNLCT policies in relation to workplace safety, antidiscrimination, anti-harassment, anti-oppression.

- ECE Certificate (Minimum 2-year program)
- Minimum 2-year experience in a supervisory role
- Excellent command of English (speaking / writing)
- CPR / FA Certification
- Police Reference check (Vulnerable Sector)
- Up-to-date immunizations including TB Test and medical clearance in case of a positive test
- Knowledgeable and sensitive to family and children settlement needs
- Experience working in a multi-cultural environment
- Mindful of and experienced on safety issues
- Experience with the delivery of online curriculum using Zoom or Teams platforms
- Strong, documented experience in the areas of use of computer technology in general and the Zoom Video Communications Platforms in particular
- Problem solving and helping parents who are not familiar with computers and video communications
- Video production
- Creation of curriculum content and use of AV materials for infants to preschoolers
- Delivering entertaining and enriching activities online.
