

Why a career in services for immigrants?

- Immigrants constitute over 20% of Canadian population. Over 50% of those living in the GTA were born outside of Canada.
- Many services are tailored to immigrants
- Jobs in immigration and settlement services have strong employment prospects
- Your immigrant experience and knowledge of cultures and languages gives you a natural advantage
- A great stepping-stone to careers in different fields: ESL teaching, government, non-profit management, immigration consultancy

Immigrants Serving Immigrants: Bridge to Employment in Working with Immigrant Populations

- 6 months of training and workplace exposure, plus up to one year of job search support
- Opens the door to a professional employment, delivering services to immigrants
- Prepares you to manage a progressive career in your field of choice
- Provides a community and a supportive environment so that you do not burn out trying to do it all alone

First-hand observations and experience in the workplace (workplace exposure)




A strong professional network, new friends, and dedicated support

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

Eligibility

• Education: post-secondary education from outside of Canada.

• Experience: Two+ years experience outside Canada in any field

• Residence: Ontario

•Language: CLB—7

•Immigration status — Permanent resident, Convention Refugee, Refugee Claimants with a valid Work Permit, Naturalized Canadian Citizen, CUAET



How do I get into the program?



Three steps





Step 3: Eligible applicants will be invited to attend an interview

Step 4: Complete Employment Ontario registration form

Step 5: Accept the admission offer and pay 50% of OBTP tuition fee





Program Details



- □ Screening of Applications ongoing
- □ Next cohort: Sep 2023
- □ Tuition fee: \$300
- □ Duration: 5 6 months
- □ Days/Time: Monday-Friday / 9am-12:30pm



Financial Support for Bridging Programs

Microloan of up to \$15,000; low interest, great for building "credit history. Check out Achēv Accelerating Career Advancement program and/or Windmill Microlending program

If you are OW recipient, discuss it with you case worker

Up to \$500 Financial Support offered by the Ministry of Labour and MNLCT for Low Income families (can't be used for tuition fee)
