## Mennonite New Life Centre introduces new Executive Director Dwayne O'Connor

Dwayne has extensive experience in executive leadership roles confronting the social and economic inequities that give rise to poverty, homelessness, mental health and addictions, and other barriers that the Centre's vulnerable newcomer clients face.

Dwayne has been actively involved in anti-racism through his work as the Chair of the Diversity Council at University Health Network, a member of the Health Equity Tribunal, and member of the Color of Poverty Network. He is also active in the Indigenous community and certified as a Feather Carrier, to help those in the community combat suicide and to celebrate life. Dwayne brings first-hand experience and compassion to his new role, arising from his own experience of homelessness as a youth and as an immigrant in his adult life.

At our recent Annual General Meeting, Dwayne expressed his enthusiasm on joining the Centre, saying, **"I am humbled by seeing** how great a team we have to work with and to have such a great set of leaders to go along with that. I cannot wait for us all to get working together."

Dwayne's comprehensive understanding and practice of collaborative community work combined with his ability to engage diverse stakeholders will serve the Centre and our communities well.

The MNLCT embarked on an extensive search for a new Executive Director after the announced departure of the previous ED in late 2022.
